

Frequently Asked Questions About People 4 Progress

1. What is People 4 Progress and what do they do?

Answer: *People 4 Progress (P4P) is a group of citizens who organized a Political Action Committee supporting passage of the December 16, 2008 new high school bond referendum. The P4P Board formed various sub-committees to focus on specific aspects of this initiative. P4P will continue its involvement in the school district following passage of the bond as a guardian of the pact established between the Board of Education and the district taxpayers; to work fundraising for an auditorium and a 3rd gym bay; and other issues pertaining to our school district.*

2. Is People 4 Progress part of the Board of Education?

Answer: *No, P4P is not part of the Board of Education. P4P is a Political Action Committee comprised of citizens in our communities operating independently of the Board of Education. P4P has the responsibility of keeping the Board of Education and Superintendent informed of activities and solicits opinions and facts from the Board of Education and Superintendent as needed.*
